MARCO, which is the abbreviation for Monsoon Asia Agro-Environmental Research Consortium, was established in December 2006, is a flexible research collaboration network. Its main aim is to facilitate international collaboration for agro-environmental research in the Asian Monsoon region in order to analyze, evaluate, and solve various problems related to the agricultural environment, and to develop and spread techniques for sustainable agricultural production that preserves environmental resources and enhances the power of biosystems.
